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Why are families making decisions about care? Some people think their families don't know them very well and they don't want them to be involved.




The bill does not deal with relationships. We know it is our right to have sexual relationships under the (United Nations) Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities. We were **told** by the Law Reform Commission that the Criminal Law (Sexual Offenses) Act 1993 would be changed at the same time as this capacity bill. We feel that by asking us these questions government will say they have consulted with us. We don't see the point if our say doesn't go anywhere **and seems to be made little of.**
