



CASE STUDIES

 Each organisation has chosen a case study

 These are not pilot projects, but ongoing work that supports individuals in the lives of their choosing whilst simultaneously forging new ways of working for the organisations



CASE STUDIES

 Every two months we ask how everyone is getting on in their case study



• What has worked?

• What has been difficult?



• What have we learnt?

O How can we implement this more widely? Is there action required at a national level?

 - We have two self advocates on the Committee












Bernie from Kildare will tell us about moving out to live independently and how it was a struggle initially to persuade her family that this was possible.

I always wanted to live independently. It's something I would have told staff over a number of years. My family never thought I could live independently.

I am independent now, happy, content and where I am living is my home now.

People often ask me 'would I like to move back home', or 'are you sorry you moved out' My answer is **no**!"



Bernie's mother explained her initial anxiety, conflict with the service provider, the struggle in 'letting go' and the trust built

"Theresa (Bernie's support person) kept working with me and kept me informed. It's very important for staff to keep working with the family and keep trust.

Theresa worked with the family and talked and talked. We had many arguments but we got over all of that. Theresa supported Bernie all the way in what she really wanted to do.

Parents, please believe in your son or daughter's ability. Let them achieve their achievements and support them in what they want to do."

iPlanit system used by Sunbeam House to make sure the goals Sam wants to achieve are at the centre of all his supports


It's my decision but you can help me.

I have peace of mind because I know who I can talk to if I need it. Using iPlanit I can see and read and know what's happening.

When you are supporting me to make big changes in my life go at 10 miles an hour, not 100 miles an hour.



The Next Steps National Project links with the work of the Housing Agency in implementing the National Housing Strategy for People with a Disability 2011-2014



- The Housing Strategy is working on how to make options available to help people live more independently.
- •We have been feeding into the development of new housing assessment protocols for Local Authorities (represented on national Housing Sub Group)
- •The options include Long term leasing, the Rental Accommodation Scheme, and CAS funding
- •With help from Co Action's advoacy group we supported the Department of Environment to produce the Easy to read version of the Housing Strategy.
- Currently working on Easy to Read version of Draft Standards for New Directions

We have been looking at Assistive Technology

We went to visit a demonstration house in Athlone. This lock can be opened with a finger print.

We invited Assistive Technology providers to come today to share information

We also set up an online forum where people can talk about a Assistive Technology to other people around the country

IMMERSION PROJECT – INTENSIVE TRAINING IN INDIVIDUALISED SUPPORTS

- April 2013 5 day intensive training programme
- Making sense of how we can deliver individualised supports
 - specifics for implementation
- Twenty five organisations participated in Immersion estimated 54 individual lives changing.
- Central involvement of key stakeholders individuals, their families, staff, community
- Key experts who have years experience in delivering individualised supports in different jurisdictions:



ENABLING EXCELLENCE

- Training programme for Supported Self-Directed Living

 follows on from requests coming out of the Immersion
 Event for in-depth transformative mentoring and practice training
- Provided by Genio in collaboration with the National Federation of Voluntary Bodies. Being delivered over 4 modules in 2 cohorts during 2014.
- 111 staff members from across 26 organisations implementation of individualised supports using the Social Role Valorisation model
- Management and CEO meetings to ensure support present required to progress change on the frontline
