Why LIFE?

Demand led; Referrals from ID students in mainstream secondary school

EPSEN is growing up, coming of age and bearing fruit

- Need for innovative and joined up services

Tailored Transitioning to Postsecondary Education

The key focus of LIFE Programme is the development of a methodology to sustain the inclusive education process for students with intellectual disabilities.

Supported transitioning until optimum mainstreaming is achieved at postsecondary level.



Rationale

> The provision of an independent learning programme for young adults with intellectual disabilities moving from second level within the Dun Laoghaire area.

Offering a full Level Three FETAC award recognised on the National Framework of Qualifications



Rationale cont'd

A combination of self directed academic achievement and targeted complementary skills teaching in inclusive postsecondary education (PSE)

Building capacity amongst education and ID service providers for strategic planning of progression routes for ID students in PSE



Aims

Offer inclusive progression opportunities for learners with intellectual disabilities who have completed second level education

Provide self directed yet supported learning and lifestyle options.

Create a template for best practice in PSE that could be replicated throughout VECs



Objectives

On completion of the programme the learner will:

Have completed a number of certified FETAC Modules at Level 2, 3 or 4.

Some will have completed the 8 modules required for a Full National Certificate on the NQF

Have attend a PSE Programme in a Further Education College



Objectives

On completion of the programme the learner will:

Have actively participated in the development of their own progression plans in conjunction Guidance Counsellors

Have demonstrated an ability to be part of a process which informs Person Centred Planning

Demonstrate greater proficiency in the areas of literacy and numeracy, computer literacy skills.



Objectives

On completion of the programme the learner will have:

Gained insights into future educational, vocational and life-style options

- Developed interpersonal and intrapersonal social skills
- Developed friendships

Completed work experience in preparation for future employment

Identified informed interests within the areas of education and employment



Referral Process

Information Sessions for Principals and Guidance Counsellors of local mainstream schools and special schools

Information sharing with potential participants and parents

- "Initial Statement of Interest Form"
- Briefing session with possible participants and parents
- Student Record Form completed by potential participant or with Referral Agent

Meeting between learner, programme co-ordinator and support service



Assessment System

Individual Education Plans (IEPs) prepared for each learner on the programme in conjunction with the relevant secondary school

Long and short-term goals agreed and recorded

Progress assessed on an ongoing basis by the tutors, learner and Project Co-ordinator

Progress Review for each training module between learners and tutors relating to specific goals identified

Portfolio of work prepared for FETAC accreditation





DLVEC LIFE Programme Content

The programme :

- > Two year (academic) Period
- Central Dun Laoghaire
- Educational Guidance

The Fetac Level 3 Certificate is awarded to a learner who meets the requirement in a total of 8 modules comprising the following <u>3 core</u> modules

- 1. Communications (1 credit)
- 2. Personal Effectiveness or Personal and Interpersonal Skills (1 credit)
- 3. Mathematics (1 credit)

And five additional modules:

e.g. Self Advocacy (1 credit), Arts Option (1 credit), ICT Module (1 credit), Language (1 credit), Preparation for Work (1 credit)
